sufficient proof of violation, even if Tenant is not observed.
5. Tenant must promptly clean and dispose of animal waste. Animal waste discovered inside the Premises
must be reported immediately with proof of proper cleaning. Failure to comply may result in a Lease Violation Fee of up to \$250, in addition to the cost of remediation.
6. Landlord will comply with all applicable requirements of federal law and the Texas Property Code,
including but not limited to Chapter 92 of the Texas Property Code, as it pertains to animals.
